Amber is Cancer Free



“Cancer can be scary. The uncertainty of a new diagnosis and everything it entails can consume you with fear if you’re not careful. Have faith. Living a life afraid is not living. Take each day as it comes and don’t worry about what you can’t control.”

At the age of 29, Amber, a registered nurse at Baylor Scott & White Medical Center – Hillcrest, received a diagnosis that changed her life. Over the course of several months, she gradually experienced shortness of breath, chest pains and numbness in her left arm, advancing to the point she was unable to grip a pen. After a few visits with her primary care provider and specialists they gained insight, but nothing compared to the news she was about to receive.

In July of 2019, Amber went to the emergency department – where she fainted. While in the ER, abnormalities and an X-ray of her left arm showed hollow bone. Amber was diagnosed with a plasmacytoma in her left arm and multiple myeloma in her bone marrow, a very rare cancer that is normally found in men 65 and older. Amber’s doctor told her that she was his youngest patient with this cancer. She started her medical leave in March 2020 and in May received a bone marrow transplant. Overcoming several side effects, including being unable to speak, move or do much of anything, Amber successfully returned to work after ringing the bell in August 2020.

Amber shared, “fighting cancer will make me a better nurse, because I see it now from both sides.”

Linear Accelerator



A linear accelerator delivers radiation therapy with pinpoint accuracy to target and treat tumors, while sparing surrounding healthy tissue. Adding a second linear accelerator

will help bring local comprehensive cancer care to even more patients in the area.

Key features

- ▶ Tailored treatments specific to each patient
- ▶ More options for treating complex cases, including lung, breast, liver, abdomen, head, and neck cancers
- ▶ Precision measured in increments of less than a millimeter with accuracy checks every ten milliseconds
- ▶ Short treatment times to reduce patient discomfort and minimize the impact on patients' daily lives
