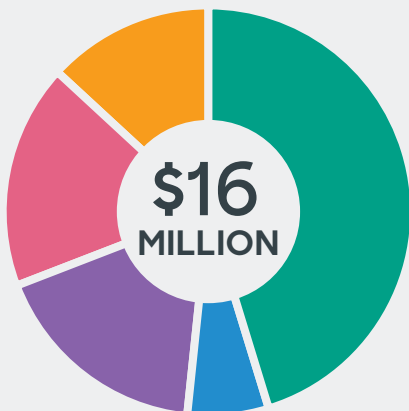

Most awarded in Texas

Baylor Scott & White has once again been recognized with more award-winning hospitals and cumulative awards than any other not-for-profit health system in Texas, with 26 hospitals receiving distinction on the *US News & World Report* 2023-2024 Best Hospitals list.



Five-star hospitals

A record 13 Baylor Scott & White hospitals earned 5 Stars for quality on the most recent Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) Star Ratings report, including our facilities in Marble Falls, Round Rock/Lakeway (shared CMS license) and Temple. Out of 3,000 hospitals rated nationally, only 16% received 5 stars. Four hospitals earned 4 stars, including our facilities in College Station and Waco.

You make a difference

Your generosity touches lives in many different ways—from providing equipment for cancer screenings to educating the next generation of care providers. We are pleased to share just a few highlights of the incredible impact you made in 2023:

Facilities to meet growing needs

Last year, you helped us build and enhance spaces that will provide increased access to care and meet the changing needs of our patients, such as:

- Expansion of the endoscopy suite in Marble Falls for diagnostic and treatment procedures related to the gastrointestinal tract
- Construction on a 165,000 square-foot expansion of our hospital in Round Rock to include a new patient bed tower, a Level II Neonatal Intensive Care Unit, additional operating rooms and cath labs, upgrades to common areas and more
- The new Robert Conte Wellness Center and nearby walking track in College Station to focus on health education, nutrition and physical activity to meet each patient's specific needs

With help from the wellness center in College Station, Matthew got his Type I diabetes under control with healthy habits that fit his needs.

Equipment to provide advanced care

In 2023, you supported advanced diagnostic and surgical services to catch conditions quickly and ease patient recovery, including:

- A new 3D mammography machine in Taylor that allows physicians to view breast tissue layer by layer
- Additional EKG machines in Waco that monitor the electrical impulses of the heart to detect heart conditions
- A new surgical robot in Marble Falls that helps surgeons plan and perform joint replacements using a 3D model of each patient's unique anatomy, leading to more balanced replacements, more precise positioning and improved patient outcomes



In its first camp since the pandemic, Camp Dreamcatcher hosted 63 campers, including current patients and cancer survivors.

Programs to serve the whole person

You supported programs that focus on meeting our patients' unique needs and caring for the whole person—including physical, emotional, mental and spiritual health—such as:

- Camp Dreamcatcher for children with cancer or blood disorders to enjoy a summer camp experience while receiving necessary care
- Child Life services and sensory toys at Baylor Scott & White McLane Children's to offer distraction, comfort and coping skills to our young patients
- A new van to transport patients in need from Brenham to College Station for cancer treatment
- Support for community health workers and a patient navigator to ensure rural patients have access to the resources they need to manage their own healthcare
